2004 RECIPIENT OF THE MALOLEY AWARD

This year's Nancy A. Maloley Outstanding Public Servant Award recipient is Indianapolis native Vicky A. Bailey. Having been nominated by President George W. Bush in 2001, Ms. Bailey currently serves as Assistant Secretary for the Office of Policy and International Affairs at the Department of Energy. She brings over 15 years of public and private sector experience in energy issues to this position. Ms. Bailey serves as primary advisor to Secretary Spencer Abraham and senior staff members on issues related to the development and implementation of the nation's energy policy. She is the lead representative in international organizations, including the International Energy Agency, and with leaders in countries around the world.

Ms. Bailey was the president of PSI Energy Inc. and the Indiana operating company of Cinergy Corporation. Prior to joining PSI in 2000, she was a commissioner at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). Ms. Bailey also was a member of the Executive and Electricity Committees of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners.

In 1986, Governor Robert D. Orr appointed Ms. Bailey to the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission. She was reappointed by Governor Evan Bayh and served seven years in this position. Before joining the IURC, Ms. Bailey was vice president for administration of the J. Bailey Company, a forty-year old family-owned business.

Ms. Bailey holds a bachelor of science degree from the Krannert School of Management at Purdue University and did post-graduate work at Indiana University.

A distinguished career and a long-standing commitment to public service make Vicky Bailey an ideal choice as the second recipient of the Nancy A. Maloley Award.
